ABOUT THE WRITERS (IN ORDER OF APPEARANCE)

Celine Huang (she/they) is a Taiwanese American writer, aspiring voice actor, and screenwriter from the suburbs of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. She graduated from New York University with a Bachelor of Arts in Social Science with a focus in Political Science and will complete her Master of Fine Arts in Creative Writing at the California Institute of the Arts in Spring 2024. Her writing focuses on the themes of growth, studying abroad, and that feeling of uncertainty when returning home. In her spare time, she enjoys traveling and visiting museums.

Lety Vargas (she/her) is a Mexican-American writer and filmmaker from Chicago, Illinois. As a writer, Lety prefers to write speculative fiction, perhaps imagining worlds and situations that are different to ours. People call her writing trippy.
